# **Parkville Campus**



- Our main campus is in Parkville, only a few minutes from the very centre of Melbourne
- Lots of cafes, galleries, a theatre, banks, bookshops, food outlets and two gyms are located on campus
- We have almost 60,000 students
- 28% are international students from over 120 countries





**Arts West** is the Faculty of Arts' principal teaching building

The Faculty of Arts is pleased to work with four Schools at Renmin on the **Pathway to Melbourne Program.** 

The program is available for students who have completed, or are in the process of completing, a Masters in their School at Renmin.

Students will be eligible to apply for entry into an approved Masters by Coursework program. Successful applicants will receive 100 credit points toward the University of Melbourne's 200 point program.

Students will either complete:

- 2 years at Renmin, followed by 1 year at Melbourne, or
- 1 year at Renmin, 1 year at Melbourne and 1 year at Renmin

- Be enrolled in an approved Masters program at Renmin AND
- By the time of commencement of the Melbourne Masters program, have completed at least one year of your approved Masters program at Renmin AND
- Have previously completed an undergraduate degree offered through Renmin or another Chinese 985 or 211 University and received an overall Graded Point Average (GPA) of at least 75% (a GPA of at least 80% from a non-211 university may also be considered); AND
- Meet English language requirements at Melbourne: an IELTS of at least 6.5, with no band less than 6, is currently required for all Melbourne Masters programs available through the agreement.
- If applying for the Master of Public Administration, please note that at least 3 years of documented relevant work experience is additionally required



### **Scholarships for Renmin students**

#### **Dean's Scholarships**:

• 25% and 50% fee remission discounts, awarded to high-achieving students, based on academic merit

#### Scholarship application process:

- All students who apply for a master's program through the joint-degree procedures will be automatically considered for a scholarship
- There is no separate scholarship application form
- Scholarships are awarded based on academic merit
- Scholarships are not able to be deferred





- 1. Visit <u>http://arts.unimelb.edu.au/graduate-studies/coursework/admissions/renmin-university-pathway-melbourne</u> and download the 'how to apply' and 'application cover' documents
- 2. Complete the application cover letter this **must** be submitted with your e-application
- 3. Make sure you meet the entry requirements
- 4. Gather the required supporting documentation
- Complete the online application at <u>http://futurestudents.unimelb.edu.au/admissions/applications/online-application-info</u>
- 6. When you get to the section that asks for you to pay the application fee, send an email to the Faculty of Arts <u>arts-graduateenquiries@unimelb.edu.au</u> with your application ID number and application cover letter Maria will arrange the application fee waiver, this takes 5 working days. DO NOT pay the application fee as it cannot be refunded once processed

NOTE: Applications take approximately 8 weeks to be assessed
